Other services



The other services industry includes a broad range of personal services; religious, civic, professional and other interest group services; selected repair and maintenance activities; and private households employing staff. The sector includes hair, beauty, funeral, dry-cleaning, diet and weight management services; religious operations; unions; professional associations; and equipment and machinery maintenance and repair.

By 2027-28, it is projected* that there will be:

116,235 people employed in other services in Queensland

+2,296 additional people employed since 2023-24

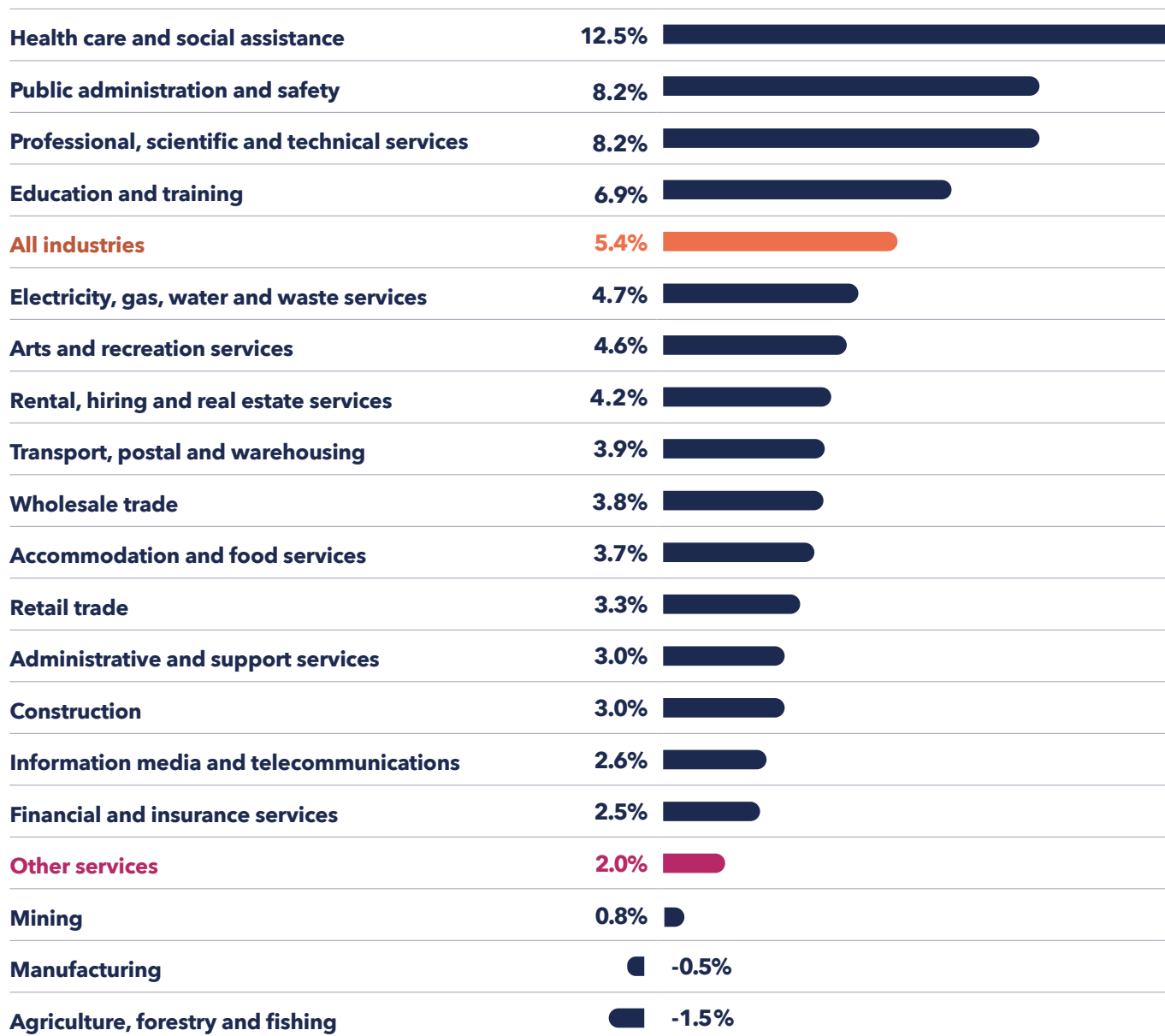

By 2027-28, employment in other services is projected to have the sixteenth-fastest growth of all industries in Queensland.



Besides the Mackay - Isaac - Whitsunday region, the proportion of workers in this industry is relatively uniform across Queensland regions.
