# **Moreton Bay -North Region**

Employment in the Moreton Bay - North region is expected to increase at an above-average rate by 2027-28. This is reflected in high levels of growth in numerous industries. The largest-employing and fastest-growing industry is projected to be health care and social assistance, where more than one in five workers are projected to be employed by 2027-28. Construction is also a large and growing industry.

#### By 2027-28, it is projected\* that there will be:

### By 2027-28, Moreton Bay - North is projected to experience the third-fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 3.1% of the state's workforce.
