Electricity, gas, water and waste services



The electricity, gas, water and waste services industry engages in the provision of electricity; gas through mains systems; water; drainage; and sewage services. It also includes the collection, treatment and disposal of waste materials; remediation of contaminated materials (including land); and materials-recovery activities.

By 2027-28, it is projected* that there will be:

39,738 people employed in electricity, gas, water and waste services in Queensland

+1,787 additional people employed since 2023-24

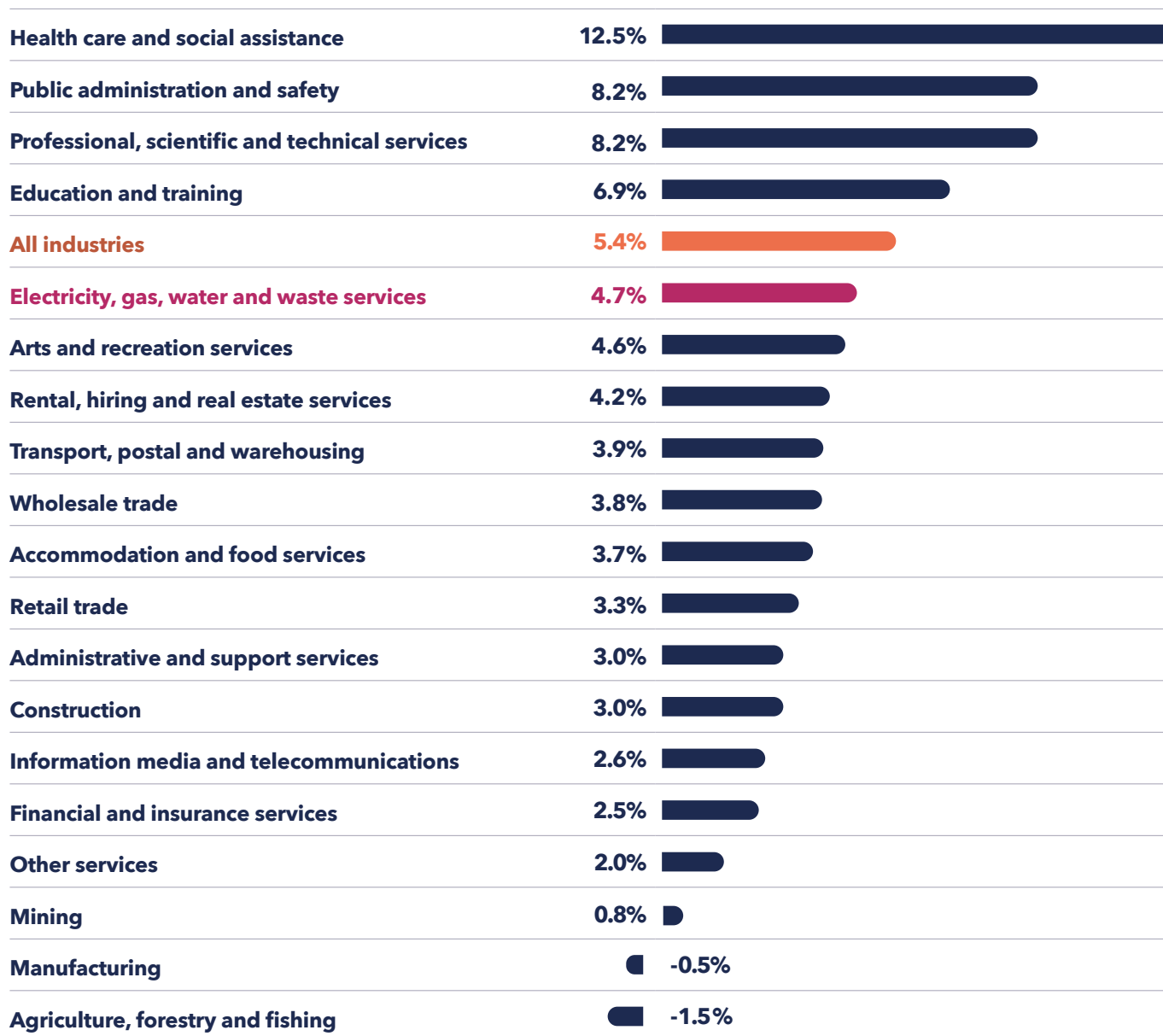

By 2027-28, employment in electricity, gas, water and waste services is projected to have the fifth-fastest growth of all industries in Queensland.



While this is a small industry, it is projected to experience above-average growth in many regions.
