Electricity, gas, water and waste services



The electricity, gas, water and waste services industry engages in the provision of electricity; gas through mains systems; water; drainage; and sewage services. It also includes the collection, treatment and disposal of waste materials; remediation of contaminated materials (including land); and materials-recovery activities.


