Retail trade



The retail trade engages in the purchase and/ or on-selling, without significant transformation, to the general public. It also includes the commission-based buying and the commissionbased selling of goods. Goods may be sold using non-traditional means including the internet. It is a large and diverse industry that includes sectors such as motor vehicle and motor vehicle parts retailing, fuel and food retailing, and other store-based retailing, such as hardware, electrical goods and pharmaceutical products.


