Wholesale trade



The wholesale trade industry engages in the purchase and on-selling of goods, without significant transformation, to businesses. It also includes the commission-based buying and/or the commission-based selling of goods on behalf of others for a commission or fee without taking title to the goods.

By 2027-28, it is projected* that there will be:

74,069 people employed in wholesale trade in Queensland
+2,743 additional people employed since 2023-24

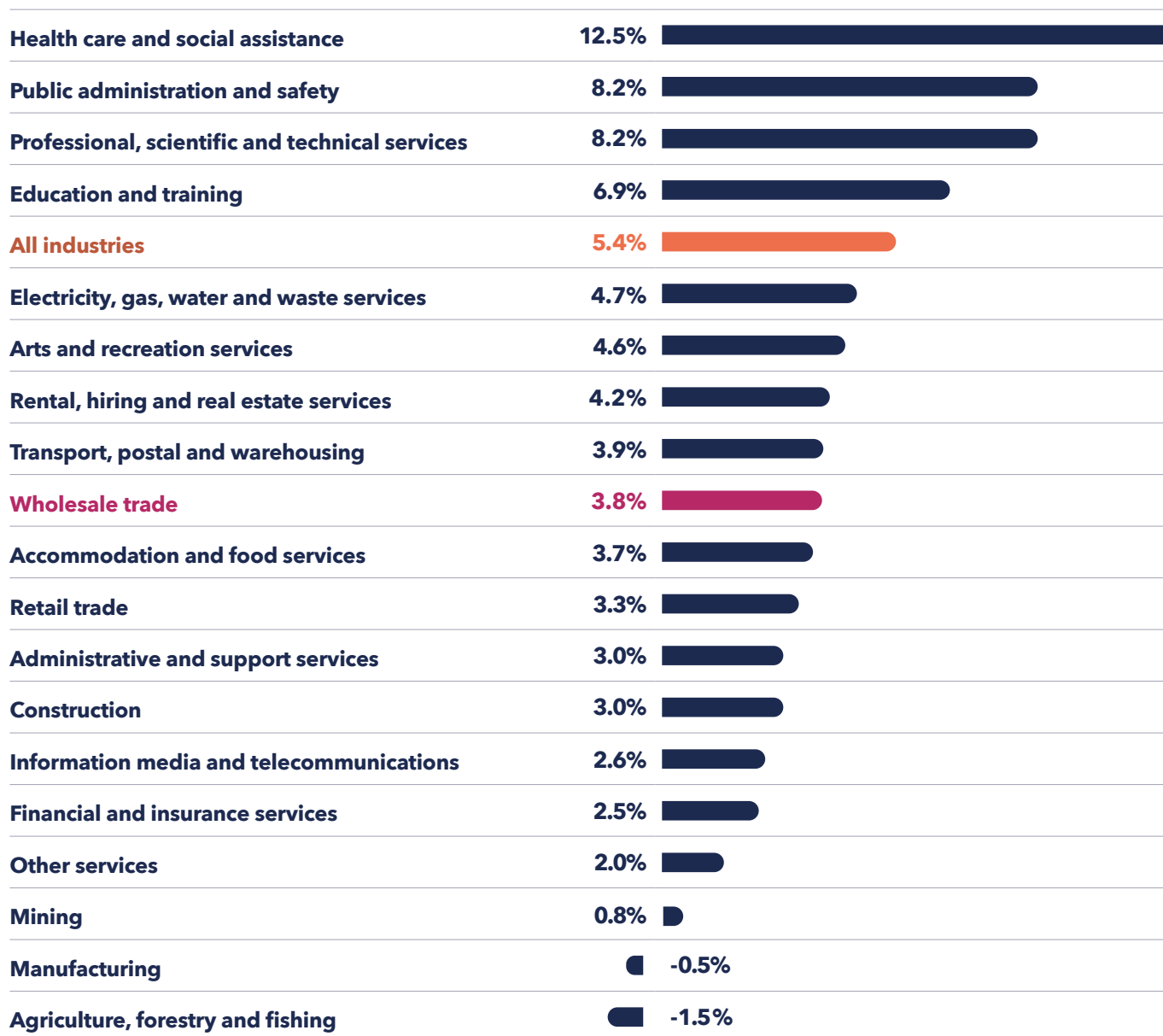

By 2027-28, employment in wholesale trade is projected to have the ninth-fastest growth of all industries in Queensland.
