## **ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS**

## **Cairns Region**

Health care and social assistance is projected to be the fastest-growing and largest-employing industry in Cairns by 2027-28. The retail trade and accommodation and food services industries continue to be major employers, employing one in five workers in the region.

By 2027-28, it is projected\* that there will be:

149,082 people employed in this region

+6,368 additional workers since 2023-24





Cairns is projected to experience the tenth-fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 4.9% of the state's workforce.
