Financial and Insurance Services

The Financial and Insurance Services industry engages in financial transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets, and/or in facilitating financial transactions. It includes sectors such as banks, building societies, insurance, superannuation funds and broking and investment services.



By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

78,037 people employed in this industry in Queensland

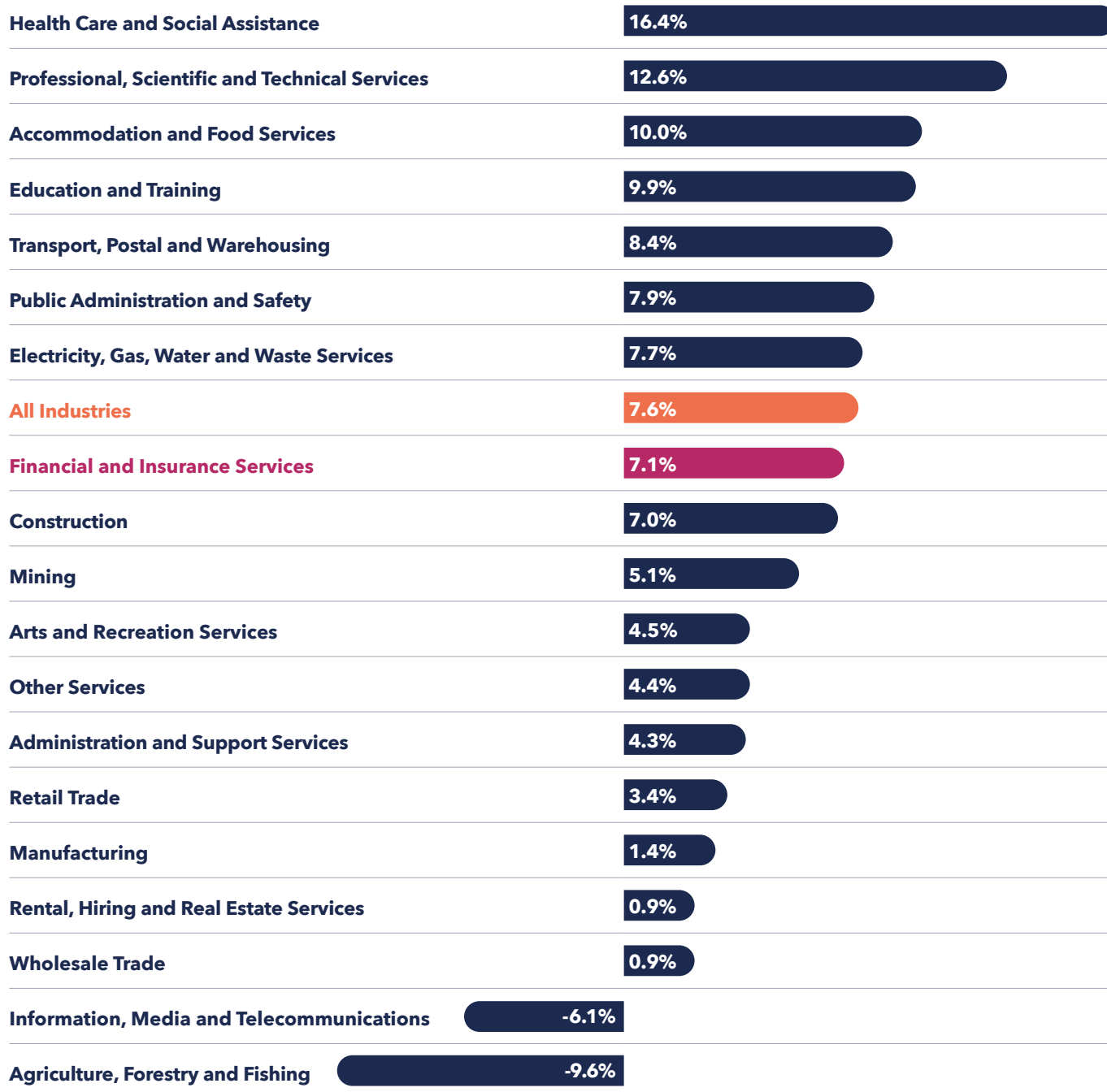
+5,174 additional people employed since 2021-22
