# Other Services

The Other Services industry includes a broad range of personal services; religious, civic, professional and other interest group services; selected repair and maintenance activities; and private households employing staff. The sector includes hair, beauty, funeral, dry-cleaning, diet and weight management services; religious operations; unions; professional associations; and equipment and machinery maintenance and repair.



By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

**114,906** people employed in this industry in Queensland

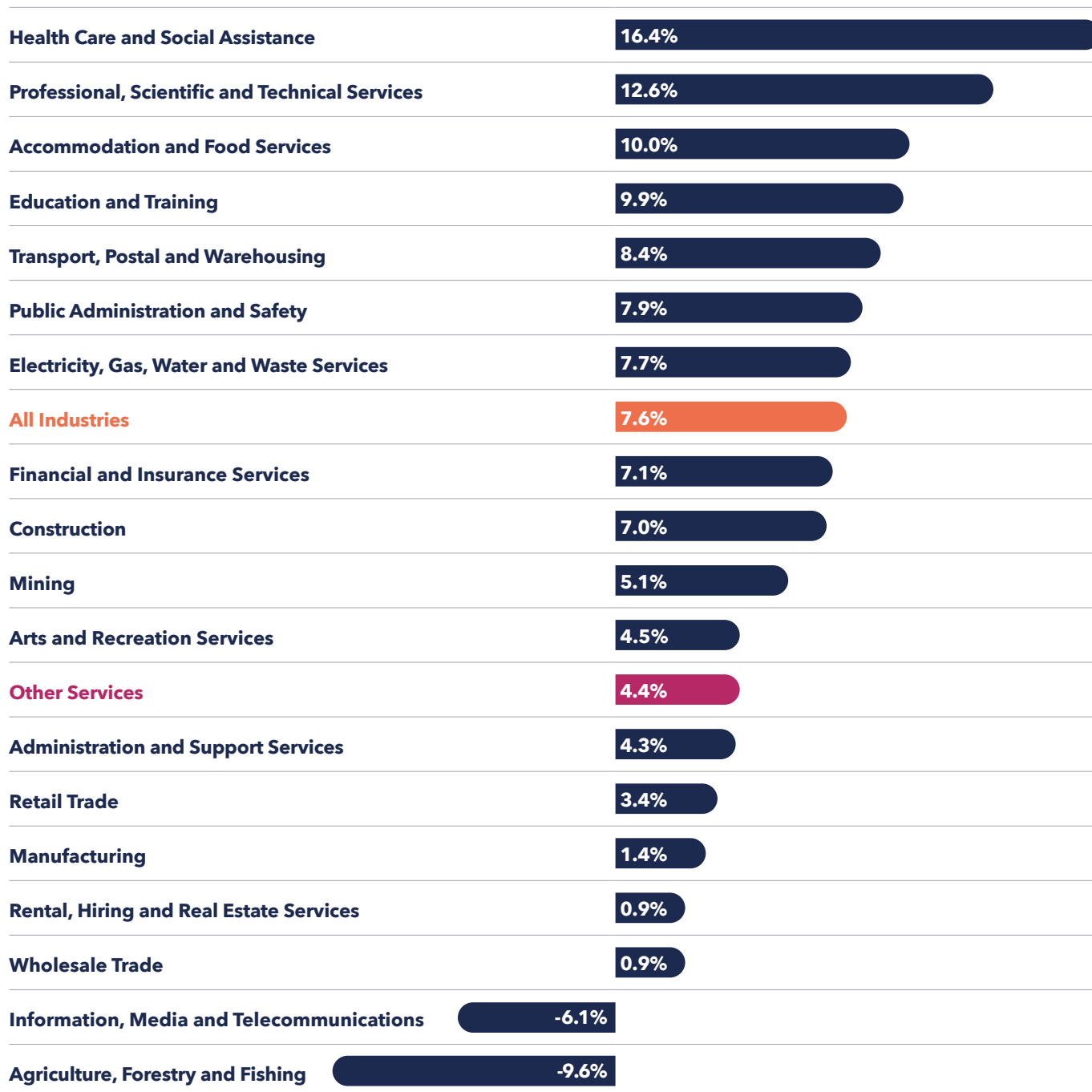
**+4,807** additional people employed since 2021-22

As these projections are high level, indicative and subject to change, it is recommended that the focus be on employment trends rather than the numbers in isolation.

By 2025-26, employment in Other Services is projected to have the 12th fastest growth of all industries in Queensland.



Besides the Far North region, the proportion of workers in this industry is relatively uniform across Queensland regions.
