Developing the Blueprint

The Blueprint is the result of extensive local consultation and research, including:

- o a partnership between Jobs Queensland, TAFE Queensland and the CSIRO
- an initial research report Growing Opportunities in the Fraser Coast: Informing regional workforce development
- the establishment of the Fraser Coast Regional Advisory Group to guide the development of the Blueprint.



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What the Fraser Coast community said

Stakeholders told us that the Fraser Coast region needed to:

- build aspirational, entrepreneurial and collaborative mindsets
- develop entrepreneurial skills and networks that will enable the region to diversify and reshape industries
- o provide agile training and development options to support future demand for continuous re-skilling
- strengthen strategies to reconnect disengaged individuals to the labour market
- build better connectivity between educators, training and employment providers, and employers to improve student/worker access to quality work-based experiences.

Policy recommendations

The Blueprint makes the following policy recommendations:

Economic development

Economic development efforts are linked to workforce development investment and coordinated across sectors to focus on building diverse economic opportunities.

Regional leadership

Community and civic leaders are encouraged to work collaboratively to develop a shared narrative and vision to realise the strengths of the region.

Stronger communities

Linkages and referral relationships are fostered, improved and maintained to provide support to employers industry groups, trainers and employment services.

Education and training

TAFE, universities and other training providers review and refine delivery methodologies to make training more flexible and accessible.

Innovation and entrepreneurship

Efforts to encourage innovation, together with the initiative, attitude and ability to thrive within a changing environment, will be implemented and supported.

Local leadership

Jobs Fraser Coast formed from the Fraser Coast Regional Advisory Group in May 2018. Members consist of local business, community and education leaders. The group provide local leadership and advocate for investment in training and skills that aligns to regional jobs and employment growth.
