Implement strategies that build and enhance industry leadership and **workforce planning capability** to support transitions in Queensland.







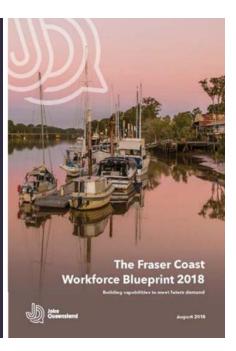

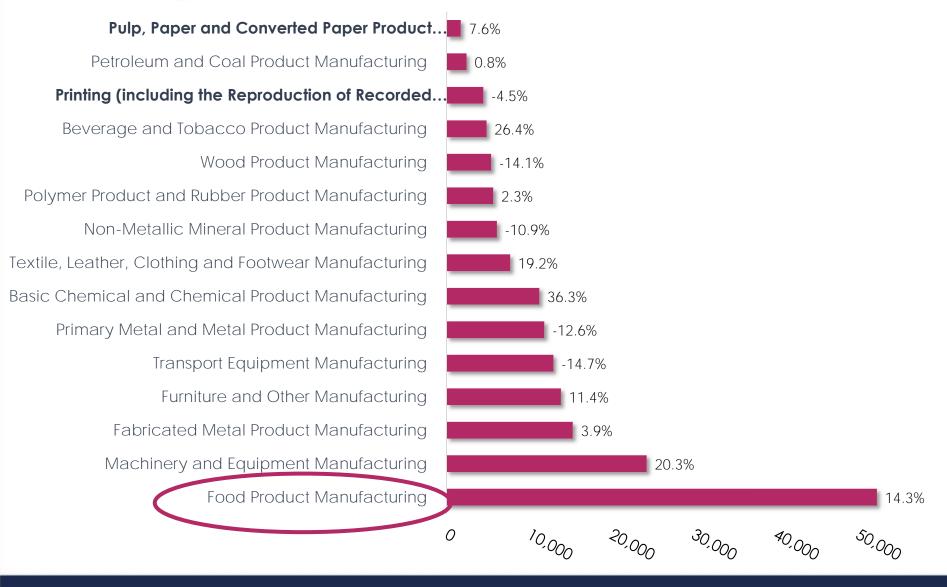




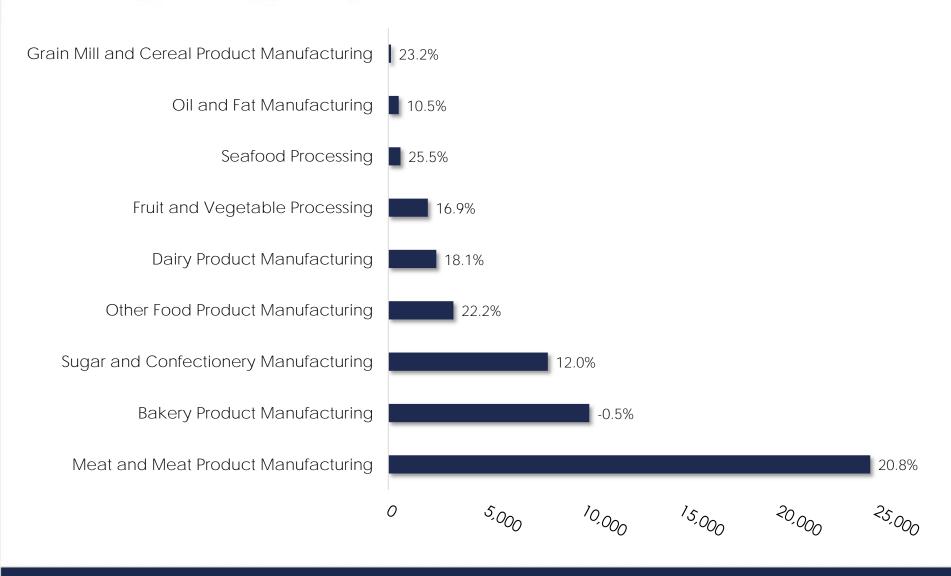
Changes in industries by 2022



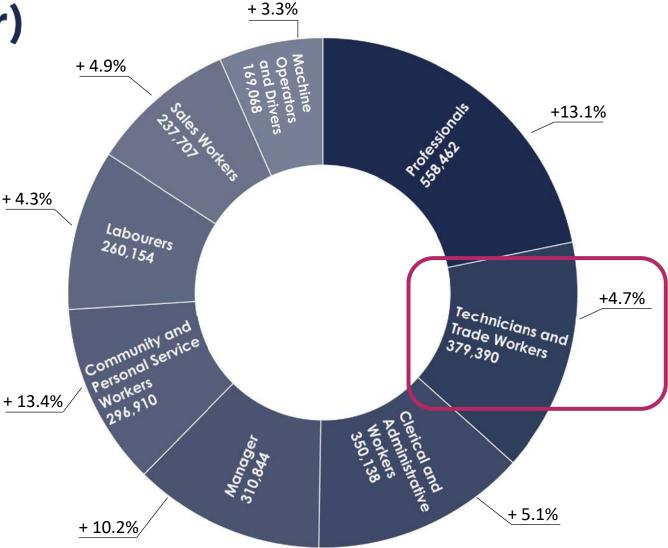
Industry subdivisions, 2022

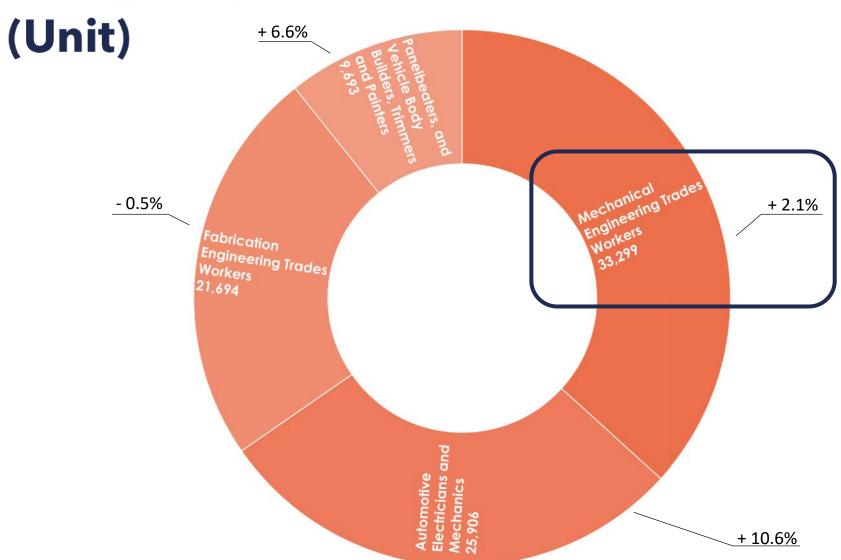

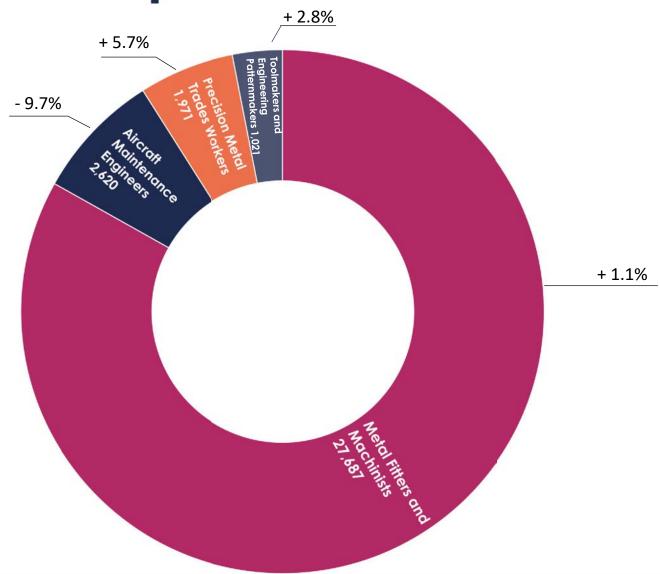

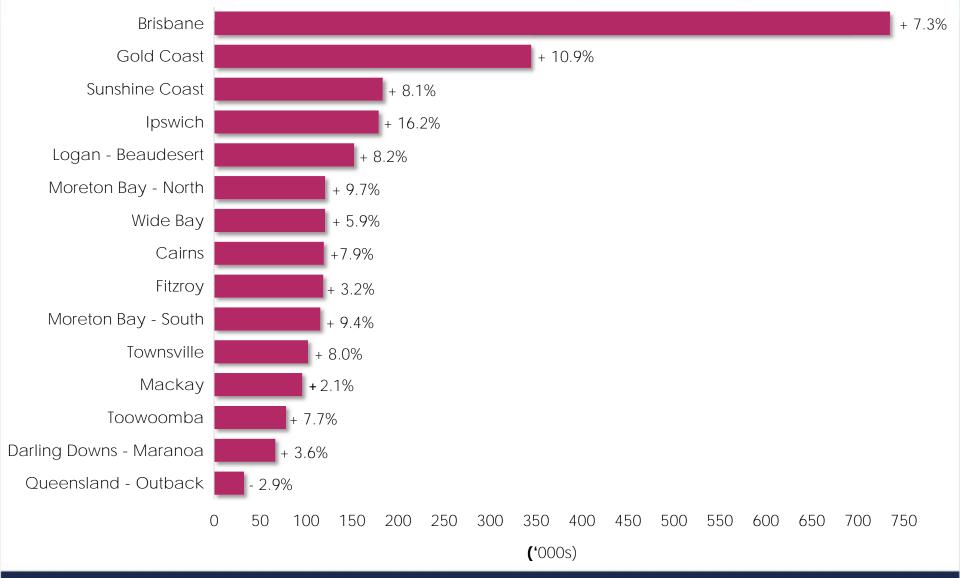


Change in occupations

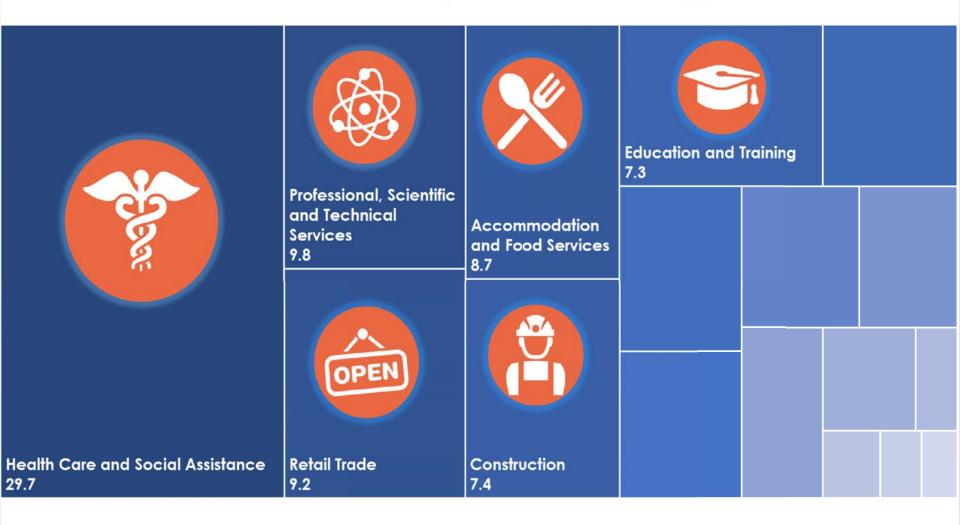




Size and growth across regions by 2022
