These AFS Series projections for 2019-2024 were finalised prior to the emergence of COVID-19 and do not take into account the impacts of the pandemic.<sup>#</sup>

Employment in the Brisbane region reflects its capital city status, with almost 40 per cent of the workforce projected to be employed in industries with high numbers of professionals. While Health Care and Social Assistance was projected to be the largest employing industry by 2024, the Professional, Scientific and Technical Services industry was projected to experience the largest growth.

By 2024, it was projected that there would have been:

836,920 people employed in the Brisbane SA4 region\*

+71,422 additional people from 2019

By 2024, Brisbane was projected to experience the seventh fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It was projected to comprise 30.7% of the state's workforce.

There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market.
