# Education and Training



The Education and Training industry engages in the provision and support of education and training, and includes preschool and school education, tertiary education and adult, community and other education (e.g. driving schools) and educational support services, such as curriculum development.

By 2024-25, it is projected that there will be:

**247,668** people employed in Education and Training in Queensland

**+30,136** additional people employed since 2020-21

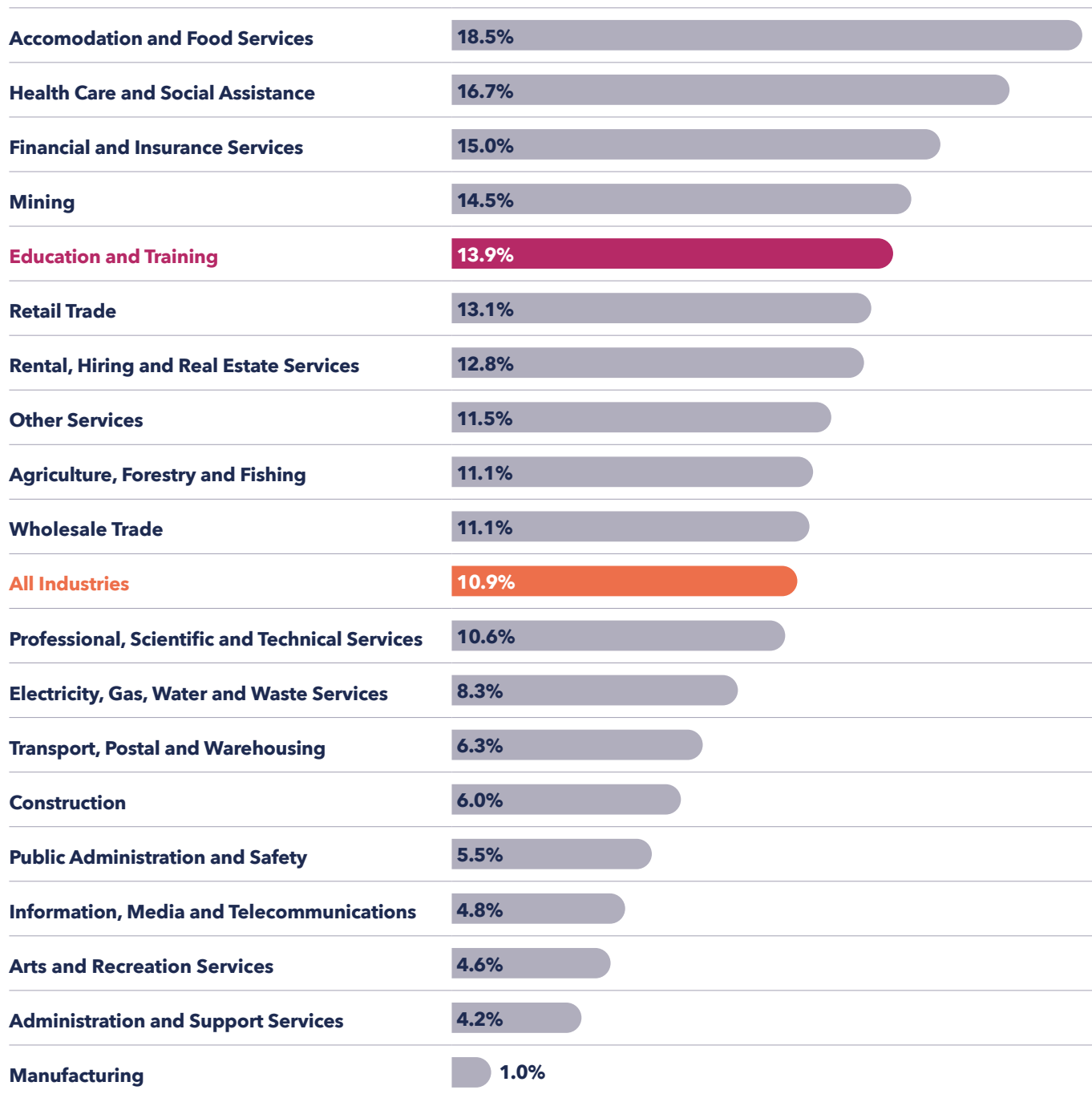

The Anticipating Future Skills project provides employment projections for Queensland between 2020-21 and 2024-25, enabling Queenslanders to identify job opportunities across industries, occupations and regions.

As these projections are high level and indicative, it is recommended that the focus be on employment trends rather than the numbers in isolation.

By 2024-25, employment in Education and Training is projected to increase at the 5th fastest rate of all industries.



By 2024-25, more than one in 10 people employed in Moreton Bay-South and Toowoomba will be employed in this industry.
