Other Services



The Other Services industry includes a broad range of personal services; religious, civic, professional and other interest group services; selected repair and maintenance activities; and private households employing staff. The sector includes hair, beauty, funeral, dry-cleaning, diet and weight management services; religious operations; unions; professional associations; and equipment and machinery maintenance and repair.

By 2024-25, it is projected that there will be:

117,538 people employed in Other Services in Queensland

+12,114 additional people employed since 2020-21

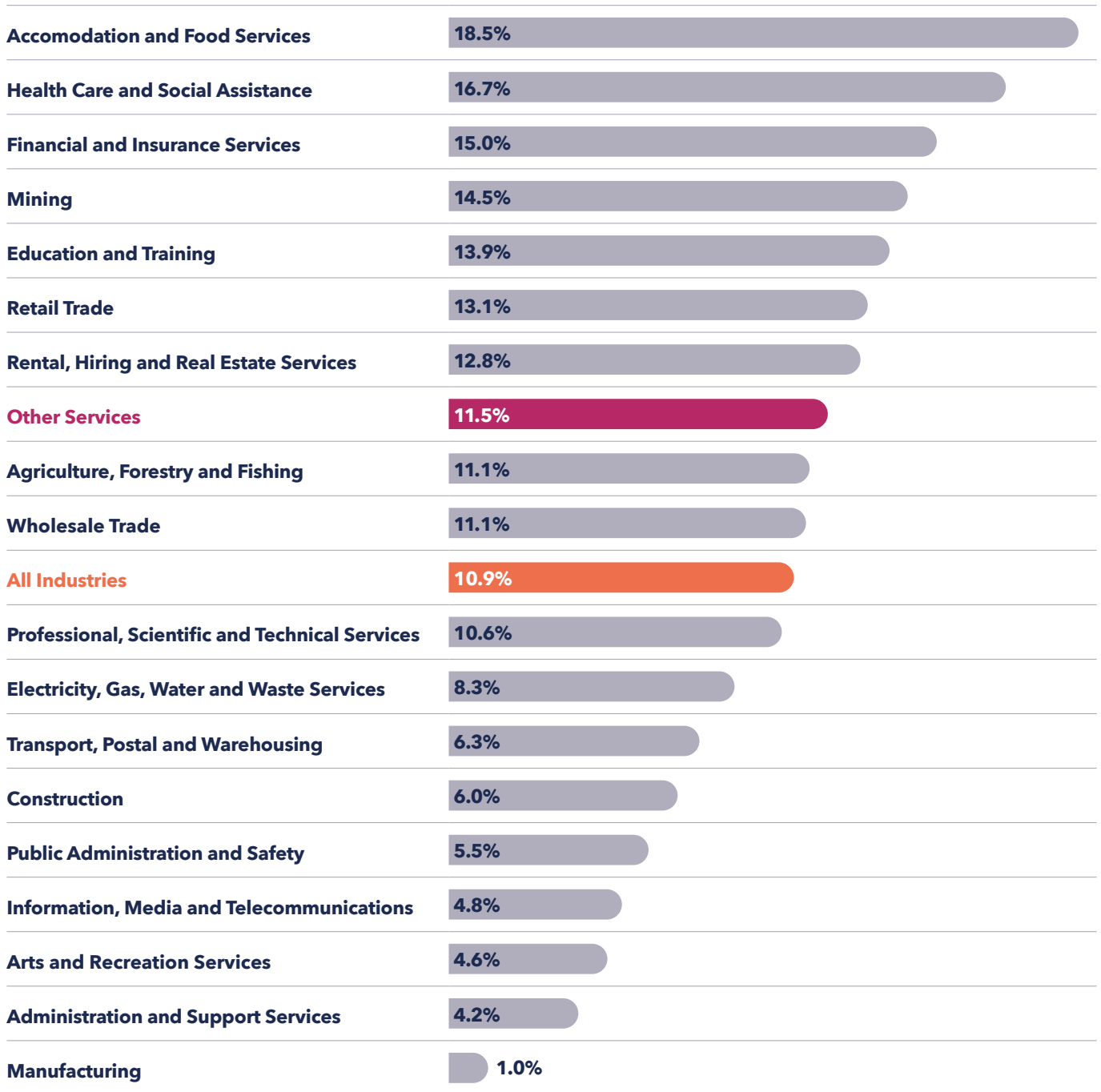

The Anticipating Future Skills project provides employment projections for Queensland between 2020-21 and 2024-25, enabling Queenslanders to identify job opportunities across industries, occupations and regions.

As these projections are high level and indicative, it is recommended that the focus be on employment trends rather than the numbers in isolation.

By 2024-25, employment in Other Services is projected to grow at above the state average.
