



Transport, Postal and Warehousing

The Transport, Postal and Warehousing industry engages in the transportation of passengers and freight by road, rail, water or air, as well as postal services, pipeline transport, and scenic and sightseeing transport. It also includes warehousing and storage services.



By 2024-25, it is projected that there will be:

143,761 people employed in Transport, Postal and Warehousing in Queensland

+8,488 additional people employed since 2020-21

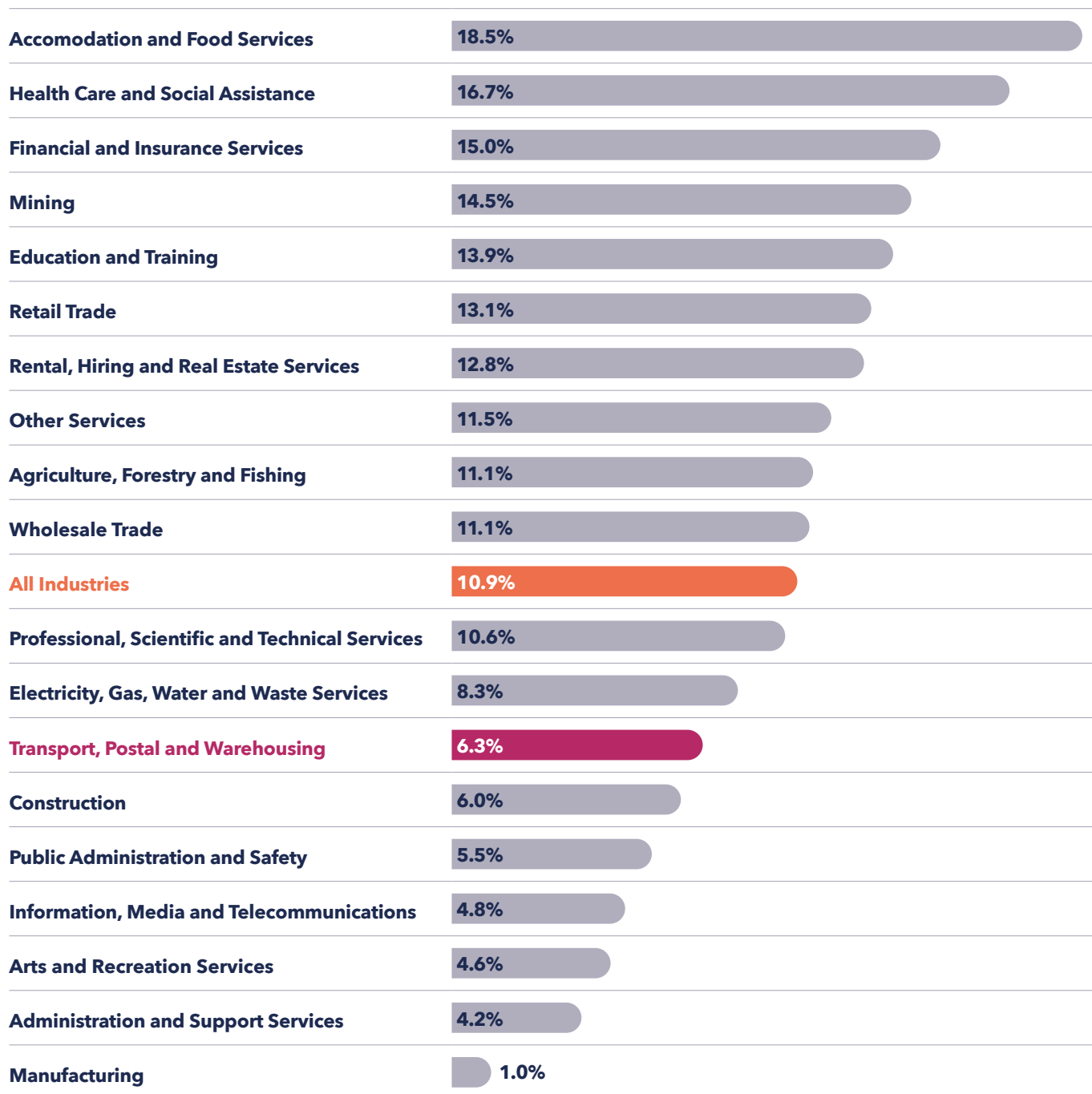

The Anticipating Future Skills project provides employment projections for Queensland between 2020-21 and 2024-25, enabling Queenslanders to identify job opportunities across industries, occupations and regions.

As these projections are high level and indicative, it is recommended that the focus be on employment trends rather than the numbers in isolation.

By 2024-25, employment in Transport, Postal and Warehousing is projected to grow at a rate lower than the State average.



The proportion of workers in this industry is relatively uniform across Queensland regions.
