## Accommodation and Food Services

The Accommodation and Food Services industry engages in providing short-term accommodation for visitors and/or meals, snacks, and beverages for consumption by customers both on and off-site. It includes sectors such as hotels, motels, cafes, pubs and restaurants.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

220,768 people employed in this industry in Queensland

+20,088 additional people employed since 2021-22
