



ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES

Central Queensland region

Employment in Central Queensland is projected to grow at above the state average. While almost 25% of the Central Queensland workforce will be employed in blue collar industries such as Construction, Mining and Manufacturing, the Health Care and Social Assistance industry is projected to be both the fastest growing and largest employing industry by 2025-26.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

138,831 people employed in this region*

+14,274 additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Central Queensland is projected to experience the fourth fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 4.8% of the state's workforce.

^{*} The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
