



ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES

Far North region

Employment in the sparsely populated Far North region is dependent on four key industries. Public Administration and Safety and Mining are the two largest employing industries, while Health Care and Social Assistance is projected to be the fastest growing industry by 2025-26.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

12,590 people employed in this region*

+541 additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Far North is projected to experience the 12th fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 0.4% of the state's workforce.

^{*}The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
