



**ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES** 

## Gold Coast region

Almost 60% of the Gold Coast workforce is projected to be employed in the five largest industries by 2025-26, with more than 15% employed in Health Care and Social Assistance. This industry is also the fastest growing in the region, while Professional, Scientific and Technical Services is projected to gain 1,500 new workers.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

348,444 people employed in this region\*

+7,416 additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Gold Coast is projected to experience the 15th fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 12% of the state's workforce.

<sup>\*</sup> The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
