

By 2025-26, Ipswich is projected to experience the 11th fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 5.4% of the state's workforce.

* The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
