



ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES

Outback - South region

Almost half of all workers in Outback - South will be employed in three industries - Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Public Administration and Safety. Accommodation and Food Services is projected to experience the fastest growth in employment by 2025-26, followed by Health Care and Social Assistance.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

9,036 people employed in this region*

-42 fewer workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Outback - South is projected to experience a slight decline in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 0.3% of the state's workforce.

^{*}The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
