



**ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES** 

## Sunshine Coast region

High population growth is projected to drive high employment growth in the Sunshine Coast region, with seven industries projected to experience double digit growth by 2025-26. This includes Health Care and Social Assistance, Accommodation and Food Services, and Public Administration and Safety.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

203,940 people employed in this region\*

**+22,695** additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Sunshine Coast is projected to experience the second fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 7.0% of the state's workforce.

<sup>\*</sup>The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
