



**ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES** 

## Toowoomba region

Employment in the Toowoomba region reflects its importance as a regional hub, with high employment in industries such as Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, and Retail Trade. Overall, Toowoomba is projected to experience employment growth higher than the state average.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

85,456 people employed in this region\*

+8,034 additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Toowoomba is projected to experience the sixth fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 2.9% of the state's workforce.

<sup>\*</sup> The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
