Townsville region

Employment growth in the Townsville region is above average. High growth in Public Administration and Safety reinforces the region's role as a provider of government services and major defence hub.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

134,375 people employed in this region*

+14,429 additional workers since 2021-22



By 2025-26, Townsville is projected to experience the third fastest increase in employment in Queensland. It is projected to comprise 4.6% of the state's workforce.

^{*} The regions used in this project are based on Statistical Area Level 4 (SA4) regions, as defined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. There are 19 SA4s in Queensland; the five Brisbane SA4s have been combined in this report to take into account the larger natural labour market. Queensland - Outback SA4 has been disagregated into its SA3 components. Data is based on Place of Work.
