Transport, Postal and Warehousing

The Transport, Postal and Warehousing industry engages in the transportation of passengers and freight by road, rail, water or air, as well as postal services, pipeline transport, and scenic and sightseeing transport. It also includes warehousing and storage services.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

151,566 people employed in this industry in Queensland

+11,728 additional people employed since 2021-22
