

ANTICIPATING FUTURE SKILLS SERIES Wholesale Trade

The Wholesale Trade industry engages in the purchase and on-selling of goods, without significant transformation, to businesses. It also includes the commission-based buying and/or the commission-based selling of goods on behalf of others for a commission or fee without taking title to the goods.

By 2025-26, it is projected that there will be:

71,883 people employed in this industry in Queensland

+623 additional people employed since 2021-22
